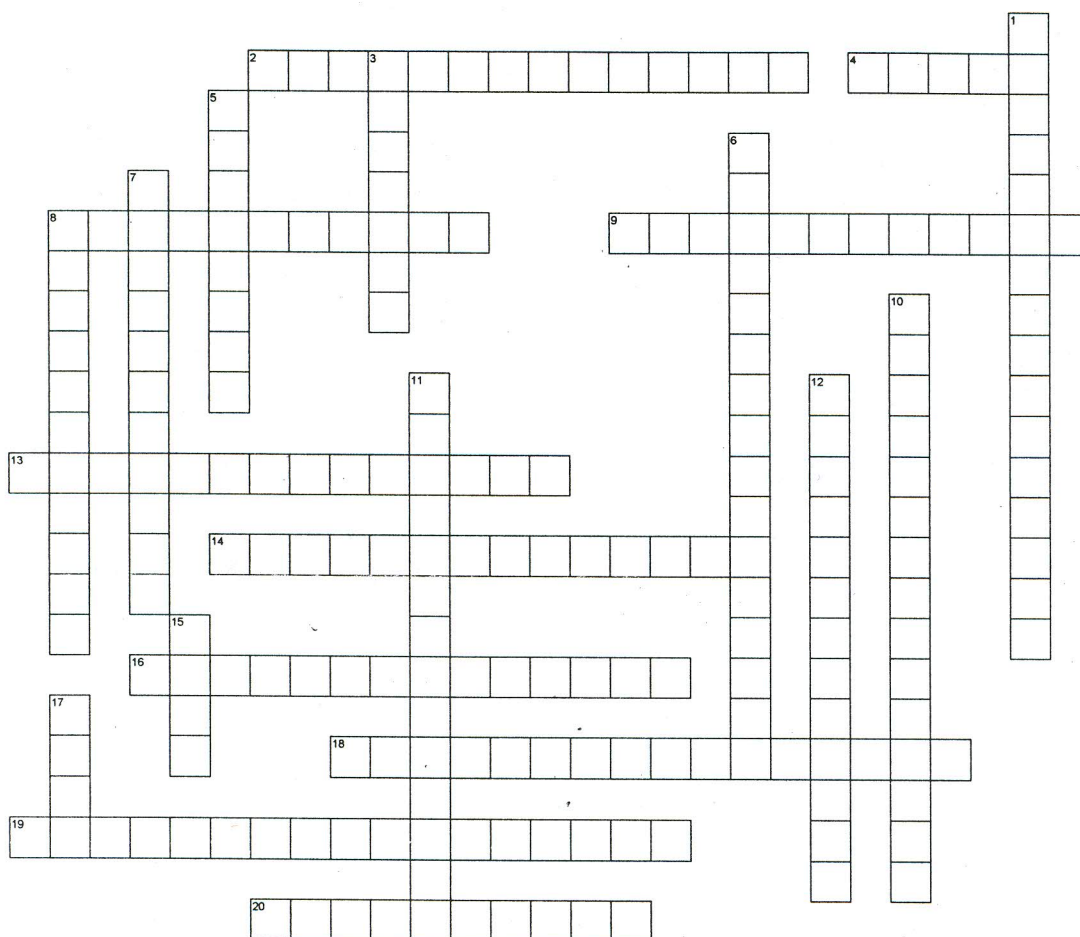

- 2 Famous writers who retreated to Europe to get away from American culture; socialized in the city's cafes.
- 4 One of the most powerful communication devices of the 1920s.
- 8 Also known as "The Monkey Trial"; cases arguing the role of science and religion in public schools.
- 9 founder of the United Negro Improvement Association (UNIA).
- 13 Opened the first birth control clinic; advocate of women's rights.
- 14 One of the most influential jazz musicians; played songs like "What a Wonderful World" with his trumpet.
- 16 Famous African American poet during the Harlem Renaissance
- 18 America's most beloved hero of the 1920s; made the 1st flight across the Atlantic.
- 19 The cultural movement in which African Americans began to take pride in their heritage; the rise of black artists, painters, actors, singers.
- 20 His development of the assembly line would reduce the time and cost in the production of this item.
- 1 Author who documented the departure of African Americans during The Great Migration; her books promoted black pride and black identity.
- 3 The Jazz Singer was the first one of these; followed silent films.
- 5 New York Yankees slugger; hit a record 60 home runs.
- 6 Penned The Great Gatsby and This Side of Paradise; coined the term "The Jazz Age".
- 7 Illegal sellers of alcohol; Al Capone made this business a criminal empire.
- 8 Underground bars that served illegal alcohol in the 1920s.
- 10 Famous writer who criticized the glory of war in novels like A Farewell to Arms.
- 11 Protestant movement that wanted the bible interpreted literally; ultra-conservatives.
- 12 Author who criticized materialism in society; wrote Babbitt.
- 15 The popular, prominent musical format of the 1920s.
- 17 More radical organization than the NAACP; wanted to spread black pride.
