

- 1 responsible for "selling" the war to the US public; headed by George Creel
- this strategy
 employed by
 Germany led to a
 public outcry
 against Germany;
 one of the
 contributing factors
 for US entry into
 WWI
- an international peacekeeping organization founded after WWI; US rejected the Treaty of Versailles because it would have required the US to join this organization

- 9 Great Britain, France and Russia
- 12 suggested an alliance be formed by Germany and Mexico
- 13 Germany, Austria-Hungary, Ottoman Empire, and Bulgaria
- case which upheld the right of the federal government to restrict freedom of speech when it presented "a clear and present danger" to the United States or its citizens
- 16 law which made it illegal to speak out against the war or the president
- 19 he claimed US involvement and

- eventual victory in WWI would "make the world safe for democracy"
- 20 event which forced Russia to "quit" the war; the Czar and his family were eventually killed by the Bolsheviks
- the leaders of Great Britain, France, Italy and the US
- 22 Germany, Austria-Hungary, and Italy

- 2 extreme pride in one's nation; desire for self-rule
- 3 policy followed by Wilson and the US during the first several years of the

- war
- 4 oversaw the conversion of a peacetime economy to a wartime economy; headed by Bernard Baruch
- 6 Wilson's proposed peace plan; all parts rejected by the Allied leaders at Versilles except for the last part the League of Nations
- 7 the calling up of troops and preparation for war
- 10 British liner sunk by a U-Boat in 1915; over 100 Americans lost their lives
- 11 leader of the opposition to the Treaty of Versailles and its League of Nations

- 14 the strategy or approach to figthing in WWI; resulted in the deaths of millions of soldiers
- 17 Austria-Hungary's declaration of war upon this nation began WWI
- 18 France, Great Britain, Russia, Italy, United States, and Serbia
