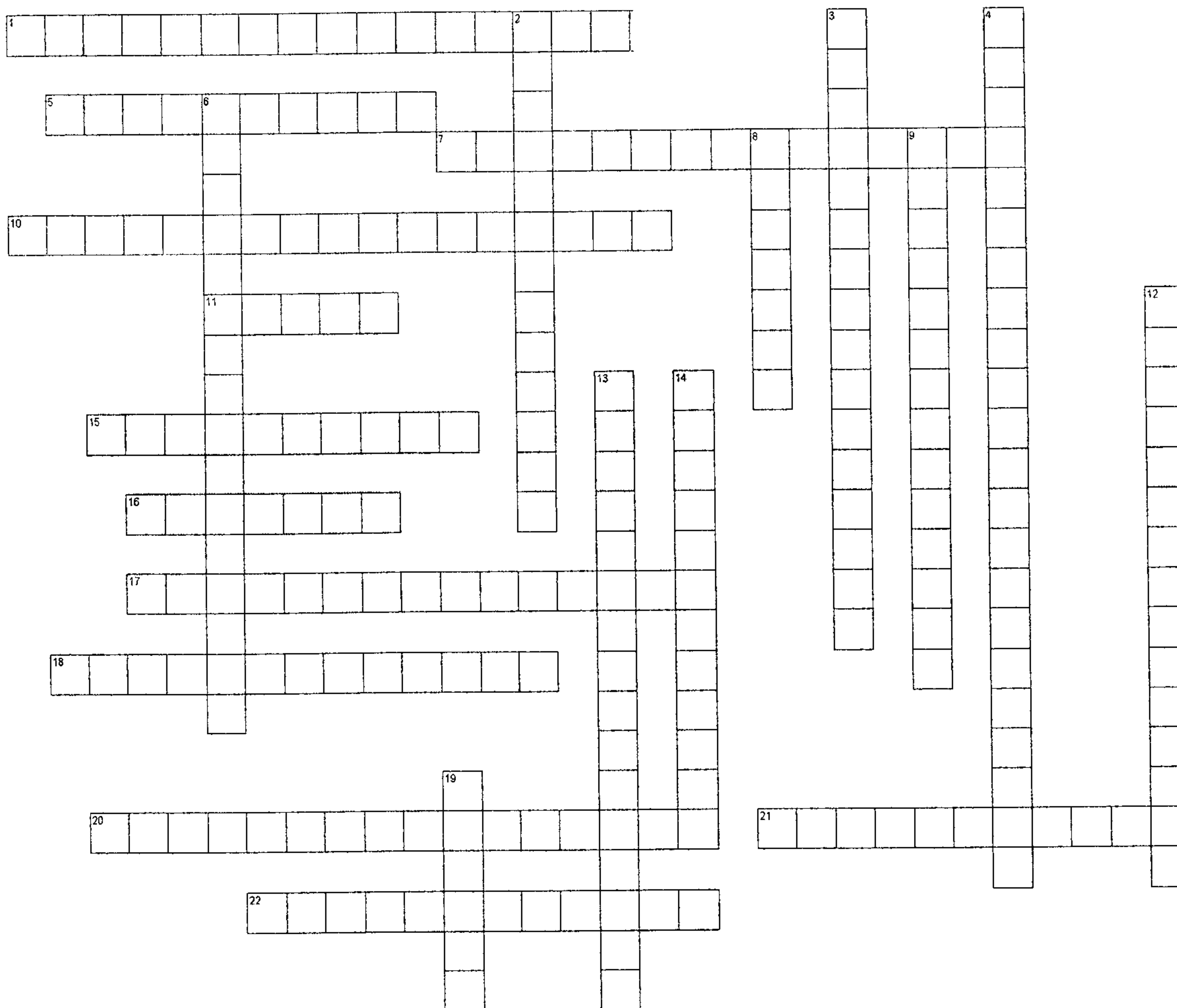

ACROSS

- 1 Prime Minister of Great Britain during WWII; one of the Big Three; opposed appeasement
- 5 Turning point on the Eastern front
- 7 Germany divided into four occupation zones; Stalin agrees to free elections in Eastern Europe and commits the Soviet Union to declaring war on Japan
- 10 mass movement of African-Americans to the war industries located in the north and west
- 11 the day Japan surrendered
- 15 German strategy of rapid ground and air assaults
- 16 second bloodiest

battle of the Pacific campaign; almost all Japanese defenders were killed or committed suicide; site of famous WWII photo by Joe Rosenthal

- 17 Japan to be stripped of all territories acquired during the war and Korea to be given its independence
- 18 commander of US Naval forces in the Pacific
- 20 signed by Hitler and Stalin; agreement not to attack or fight each other
- 21 The policy of giving in to aggressor nations
- 22 total control by a state government; no rights for individuals

DOWN

- 2 Americans who believed the US should not involve itself in wars overseas
- 3 delivered by FDR; stressed the need for free nations to isolate dictatorships
- 4 Supreme Court ruled the internment of Japanese-Americans was justified on the grounds of military necessity
- 6 Americans who believed the US could not and should not stay out of the war in Europe
- 8 nationalistic sentiment and devotion to the state over individual

interests

- 9 forbade the sale of weapons to nations at war or involved in civil wars; passed by Congress as a means of keeping the United States out of war
- 12 figurehead ruler of Japan; believed to be a direct descendent of God by the Japanese
- 13 Turning point on the western front; commonly referred to as D-Day
- 14 the supplying of weapons to countries which were fighting the Axis Powers; Great Britain was the primary recipient
- 19 government aid to veterans; assistance for homes, college,

job training, and businesses
